"Conciliation and Strike Mandate Vote"

Conciliation: Awaiting Dates

The Labour Board has assigned us a Conciliation Officer

• We are currently awaiting contact from the conciliator to set dates for conciliation.

Negotiations are continuing

- Negotiations are ongoing to clarify positions on the big issues and resolve language on less contentious matters.
- We seem to have reached an impasse on
 - o language pertaining to job security and continuity DTLs,
 - concessions that would significantly reduce access to teaching support funds and course releases for research,
 - a concession related to tenure clock extensions that could significantly disadvantage some pre-tenure Members, and
 - language we want that would commit the institution to maintaining our current complement of tenure track positions as people retire.

CAUT Legal Defence Fund

- RAAS has applied to CAUT for Directors approval for access to Daily Strike Fund Benefits, a Strike Support Loan, a Group Insured Benefits loan, and Strike Support Actions <u>in case</u> we eventually need them.
 - Requests are normally granted; access to the benefits is not triggered unless the union is forced to strike.

Next Step: Strike Mandate Vote?

- The RAAS Executive is seriously contemplating holding a strike mandate vote.
 - A positive strike mandate vote shows your negotiating team (and administration) that we are united in where to draw the line in our negotiations.
 - A negative strike mandate vote, conversely, shows the Negotiating Team and administration that RAAS members are prepared to concede.
- A strike mandate vote does not automatically trigger a strike and most often does not lead to a strike at all.
- The reason for a strike mandate vote now to is to put pressure on the administration to soften their position on key negotiation issues and break the impasse.

Western University Librarians and Archivists reach a tentative deal!

After holding a strike vote with a 100% "Yes" vote and then conducting a 'strike aversion' campaign to put pressure on their administration, Librarians and Archivists at Western have manage reach a tentative deal.

Members of that faculty association will be voting to ratify the deal this week.
